OIT will be performing an upgrade of our file servers in the coming weeks. This document includes the new path to Brown's department file services.

If you are referencing this document before March 24, 2025, please use the term "files.brown.edu" anywhere you see "files22.brown.edu". After March 24 at 7am, files22.brown.edu will be active.

- 1. Open <u>Finder</u> on a Mac (the program you use to browse your files). If you open any folder on your Mac, you will be in Finder.
- Look for the Go menu along the top of your screen. From this menu, select Connect to Server.
- 3. You will be prompted to enter a path (address) for the share. Check with your Department's IT Support for your correct share name. The general format is as follows, italics replaced with your information:
 - For your network home folder: smb://files22.brown.edu/home/username
 - 2. For a **research share:**

smb://files22.brown.edu/research/LabName_Shared

3. For your **personal share:**

smb://files22.brown.edu/dfs/DepartmentName_Users/username

- 4. For your departmental share: smb://files22.brown.edu/dfs/DepartmentName_Shared
- 5. For VAST research share (replicated): smb://files22.brown.edu/research/LabName_Shared
- 6. For VAST research share (non-replicated):
 smb://files22.brown.edu/lrsresearch/LabName_Shared

You will be prompted to log in with your Brown username and password.

4. Your folder will open. You can open files and drag files to and from the folder.
