- <u>How to Request a Loaner Mobile Phone</u> Brown University faculty and staff can request a loaner mobile phone for any period of time shorter than 6 months.
- <u>Reporting a Security Incident</u> If you are aware of a security incident or have been successfully targeted by a malicious threat actor, it is crucial to report the incident immediately.
- <u>Connect to the Eduroam Network</u> Eduroam is a free, secure worldwide access service which allows students, researchers and staff from participating institutions to connect to the internet at other participating institutions in the United States as well as worldwide.
