There are a number of excellent **FREE** training and support resources for Tableau products.

Resource	Description
Free training from Tableau	The makers of Tableau products offer a variety of free training. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tableau Starter Kits—Practice authoring, interacting, publishing, and administering Tableau through a multimedia introduction to Tableau.• Watch on demand videos (topics range from a few minutes to 1+ hours)• Live online training (or view past training recordings)• Attend a webinar (or view past webinar recordings)
LinkedIn Learning	Take advantage of Brown's free LinkedIn Learning site license. Check out training on these topics: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Tableau training• Data visualization training
Rhode Island Tableau User Group	Join the local Tableau user group (TUG) hosted by the Providence Public Library . Meets quarterly.
Udemy	While not free, Udemy offers more affordable Tableau training (sometimes on sale for under \$20!). Brown users who took their Master Course in Tableau 10 & 2019 for Business Intelligence gave it excellent reviews and described it as good for users who have mastered the basics with free training from Tableau and LinkedIn Learning (see above) and want to take it to the next level. Please note, this particular course teaches an outdated version of Tableau Desktop as of this writing.
Weekly Wind Down Webinars (past recordings)	UPDATE: Senturus no longer runs this series, but previous recordings are available . On Friday afternoons, Senturus, offers a free 30-minute webinar with tips, tricks, and tutorials for Tableau Desktop users and/or Cognos Analytics authors (many of our users use both!).
Workshops at Brown	The University Library periodically holds hands-on workshops to introduce the features of Tableau Desktop. Watch Today@Brown and the Library Calendar for the next scheduled workshop.

Knowledge Base	Tableau publishes articles in their Knowledge Base describing problems and solutions to customer support tickets.
Community Forums	In the Tableau Community Forums you can: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Browse topics, ask questions, and share your insights. • Participate in User Groups (check out the Newbie and Higher Education groups!) • Vote on product Ideas or submit your own
Tableau Prep	Master Tableau Prep with this list of learning resources .
Tableau Public Gallery	The Tableau Public Gallery is great for inspiration. Browse or search visualizations by keyword. See something you like? You can download a visualization and take a peek under the hood to see how it was accomplished. Note: Tableau Public is a free product. Visualizations are published to the Tableau Public Server to be available in the gallery for the world to see and enjoy. Published visualizations can also be embedded on a web page.
Workbook & Calculation Library	Browse and share Tableau Workbooks and calculations.
Data Revelations Blog	Stephen Wexler as an experienced Tableau trainer and author who writes an informative blog including content on visualizing survey data , which can be tricky. Subscribe here .
Tableau Conference Presentations	The conference sells out annually. Didn't make it or don't have the budget to attend? No sweat, you can watch the conference presentation recordings online.
