Microsoft removed Equation Editor features in Office for security reasons in January 2018 patches, which will make existing equation objects made with the tool read-only.

You can insert and edit new equations using the editor built into Office version 2007 or later. For more information about inserting and editing equations, see [Write, insert, or change an equation](#). However, you will not be able to edit existing equations that were inserted using Equation Editor 3.0 in that manner.

Alternatively, the third-party app MathType enables you to edit Equation Editor 3.0 equations without security issues. MathType is now part of the Wiris Suite. You can download a free MathType 30-day trial at: <http://www.wiris.com/en/equation_editor/microsoft>

If you want to obtain a long-term copy of Mathtype, an academic license is available at \$57 per person. Purchase details are available at <<http://store.dessci.com/?>>.
